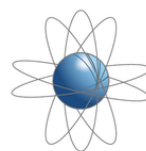

• Supporting Health Sciences Schools in Simulation-Based Education

Morocco Sim continues to support health sciences schools in integrating simulation-based education through high-quality faculty development programs. Recent initiatives included a masterclass for instructors from the OFPPT Health Training Institutes at IFMS Rabat, focusing on simulation pedagogy, debriefing, and educational innovation, as well as the first Medical Education Summer School (MESS 2026) for faculty members of the Faculty of Medical Sciences, Mohammed VI Polytechnic University (UM6P), Ben Guérir. On income or consumption inequality, South Africa ranks at or near the top globally. The World Bank reports a Gini around 0.64 for 2018 and calls South Africa the most unequal country among those with comparable data.
